### USES FOR SOAP

Soap is known mostly for removing dirt from grimy hands. But with a little creative repurposing, soap in both its bar and liquid form can simplify a bunch of projects.

- By first rubbing soap on the nail shank, nails drive easier with less risk of splitting the wood.
- Smooth caulk beads with a moist, soapy finger.
- Remove wallpaper glue by sponging warm soapy water on the walls.
- Lubricate the metal rails of sticking desk drawers.
- Turn screws more easily by dabbing it on the threads.
- Keep garden bugs off plant leaves by mixing it with water and spraying the solution on the leaves' undersides.
- Detect gas leaks by mixing it with water and rubbing on pipe joints; if bubbles form, you found the leak.
- Snap aluminum or vinyl siding into place easier with a zip tool that's been dapped with the liquid.
