This progress ensures a smooth transition to the next phase of construction.


PROJECT UPDATE

Lombardo's Deli Expansion

Wagman is working with Lombardo's Deli on an 11,321 SF expansion of their restaurant in Lancaster, PA. The \$7.5 million project will include the addition of outdoor dining areas, an enlarged kitchen, a deli, and a private cigar lounge. The existing restaurant and new deli would both be served by an expanded kitchen connecting the two buildings. The expanded kitchen will include a chef's table experience, where a small number of diners could watch the kitchen staff at work. Lombardo's also plans to add two adjacent outdoor dining areas for the deli and restaurant. This collaborative effort between Wagman, RLPS Architects, and Lombardo's Deli promises to be a landmark addition to Lancaster's culinary scene. With its focus on fresh, flavorful food, expanded offerings, and unique experiences, the project is poised to become a popular destination for locals and visitors alike when it is completed in July 2024.







PROJECT UPDATE

Hamilton Health Center

The Wagman Construction team continues to make progress at the 20,000 SF Hamilton Health Center project by Steel Works Construction. The site, part of a mixed-use development, will provide critical, affordable healthcare to the surrounding Steelton-Highspire community. The new, two-story structure will consist of medical exam rooms, administrative offices, and clinical spaces to support Hamilton Health's primary care, mental health, substance abuse, and WIC program services.

The project team is currently working on the outside of the building, installing metal panels and soffit ceilings under the canopies.

The \$4 million project is slated for completion in June of 2024. Upon its completion, the new Hamilton Health Center location will provide the Steelton-Highspire community residents with access to quality, affordable healthcare services in a state-of-the-art facility.



Wagman Wins ABC National Pyramid Award

Wagman Construction received a 2023 Excellence in Construction Pyramid Award at the prestigious ABC National Awards in Kissimmee, FL on March 14, 2024. The EIC awards recognized 91 of the nation's top construction projects in 2023 as the leading national competition that annually honors general and specialty contractors for industry-leading, safe, and innovative construction projects from across the country.

Wagman received the award in the General Contractor, Commercial \$5 to \$10 Million category for the David H. Martin Excavating – Office Expansion and Renovation project. This project successfully overcame challenges like extended material lead times due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ultimately exceeding the client's expectations. The David H. Martin project showcases unique industrial finishes with exposed ceilings, structural steel, interior brick veneer, wood accent walls, and a central open-air, two-level atrium.
